

Remembrance - 100 days of prayer

Remembrance100 launches on 4 August with 100 days of prayer for peace from 4 August to 11 November. On 4 August 1918 King George V, the Queen's grandfather, called a National Day of Prayer. He and Queen Mary met in Westminster to pray with members of the Houses of Parliament. One hundred days later, the war ended. Christians from across the denominational spectrum and in many different contexts have contributed thoughts and prayers for peace, which will be shared through social media to promote peace and reconciliation, and to encourage churches, schools and communities to reflect on the past and bring hope for the future. The prayers will also be available to download. The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby writes, 'From 4 August 2018, in churches across this country, let us mark 100 days with prayers for peace, hope and reconciliation.'

Amos 7:7-15



This is what he showed me: The Lord was standing by a wall that had been built true to plumb, with a plumb line in his hand. And the LORD asked me, "What do you see, Amos?" "A plumb line," I replied.

Then the Lord said, "Look, I am setting a plumb line among my people Israel; I will spare them no longer.

"The high places of Isaac will be destroyed and the sanctuaries of Israel will be ruined; with my sword I will rise against the house of Jeroboam."

Amos and Amaziah

Then Amaziah the priest of Bethel sent a message to Jeroboam king of Israel: "Amos is raising a conspiracy against you in the very heart of Israel. The land cannot bear all his words. For this is what Amos is saying:

"'Jeroboam will die by the sword, and Israel will surely go into exile, away from their native land."

Then Amaziah said to Amos, "Get out, you seer! Go back to the land of Judah. Earn your bread there and do your prophesying there. Don't prophesy anymore at Bethel, because this is the king's sanctuary and the temple of the kingdom."

Amos answered Amaziah, "I was neither a prophet nor the son of a prophet, but I was a shepherd, and I also took care of sycamore-fig trees. But the LORD took me from tending the flock and said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'
